Here, faith is etched in stone—a profound, 1,700-year-old heritage waiting to deepen your spiritual journey.

TRAVEL GUIDE

Day 1 Departure

Departure from home country and arrive to **Zvartnots International Airport** in **Yerevan**.

In the morning, visit the **Matenadaran**, a **Museum of ancient manuscripts**, and then proceed to the **Garni Temple** (a **UNESCO World Heritage** site). It is the **only pagan temple** in the territory of Armenia, built in the **1st century AD** by the Armenian King **Trdat I**. It is dedicated to the **God of Sun, Mithras**. The Garni Temple lies about **32 km east of Yerevan**, and the complex hosts a number of buildings including a royal palace, a Roman bath, and a church. Destroyed by an earthquake in **1679**, the Garni Temple was **reconstructed in the 1970s** and is now made up of both original and replacement masonry. Enjoy the beautiful sounds of the **Armenian Duduk** in the Garni Temple, an **ancient double-reed woodwind flute** made of **apricot wood**. It is indigenous to Armenia and was proclaimed a **Masterpiece of the Intangible Heritage of Humanity** in **2005**.

Day 2 Garni/Geghard/Matenadaran/Yerevan 80 km

Have lunch in a rustic house and discover how the traditional Armenian flatbread **Lavash**, inscribed in **2014** on the **UNESCO Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity**, is made. The next stop is **Geghard** (a **UNESCO World Heritage site in Armenia**), an incredible **medieval Armenian monastery**, partly carved out of a mountain. Though the monastery has been around since before the 4th century, the **main cathedral** was built in **1215**. The existing ensemble dates back to the **12th-13th centuries**, the time of the flourishing of national culture, especially architecture. Enjoy a **quintet choir** in Geghard for **25 minutes**, a **spiritual concert of Armenian medieval music** in the **Geghard Monastery**. Drive back to Yerevan. Dinner at the hotel. Overnight in **Yerevan**.

Day 3 Lake Sevan/Dilijan/Haghartsin/Dilijan 190 km

In the morning, proceed to the **Noraduz Cemetery** of **Khachkars** (**cross-stones**). Noraduz is the **largest surviving medieval cemetery** with **khachkars**. Since **2010**, **khachkars**, their symbolism, and craftsmanship are inscribed on the **UNESCO List of Intangible Cultural Heritage**. Proceed to **Lake Sevan**, one of the **world's high-altitude lakes**. Take the stairs to the top of the **Sevan peninsula** to enjoy the **breathtaking scenery**. Now it is time to uncover the secrets of the Sevan Monastery dating back to the **9th century**. **St. Arakelots** and **St. Astvatsatsin** churches are beautiful examples of **Armenian church architecture** of the **medieval period**.

Proceed to **Dilijan**, known as **Armenian Switzerland**. Dilijan attracts visitors with **lush forests, fertile meadows**, the rushing **Aghstev River**, and its **stunning and quiet nature**. Stroll through the picturesque **Old Quarter**, particularly **Sharambeyan Street** and its **artisan shops**. After taking another **18 km drive** through a forest road, find the hidden treasure—the **13th-century Haghartsin Monastery**. Dinner at the **Paradise Hotel** in Dilijan. Overnight in **Dilijan** (Best Western Paradise or similar).

Day 4
Haghpat/Gyumri
240 km

Drive to the **Lori region**. The **Debed Canyon**, **Pambak** and **Lori mountain chains**, and the rushing **Debed River** will make your drive a very enjoyable experience. The **Monastery of Haghpat** (a **UNESCO World Heritage Site**) was founded in **976** during the reign of **King Ashot III Bagratouni**. The **oldest structure** of the Monastery is the **Church of St. Nshan**. It is of the **domed-hall type** and was consecrated in **991**. The monastic complex also includes: a small domed church of St. Grigor, the chapel of St. Astvatsatsin, the **scriptorium**, and the **refectory**. After lunch, proceed to **Gyumri**. Dinner in **Gyumri**. Overnight in **Gyumri** (**Shiraz Radisson Blu** or similar).

Day 5
Gyumri/Aruch/Yerevan
125 km

Gyumri is the **second largest city in Armenia** and the capital of the **Shirak Province** in the northwestern part of the country. It was originally founded as **Kumayri**, later re-founded as **Alexandropol** between **1837** and **1924** during the Russian rule, then **Leninakan** between **1924-90**, and then as **Gyumri**. Four percent of the **Catholic population of Armenia** lives in **Gyumri**. The major **Catholic Church (2010)**, the **Boghossian Centre**, and the **Armenian Sisters of the Immaculate** are all located in **Gyumri** and nearby villages (**Ashotsk**). **Khachkar** (cross-stone) making workshop in **Gyumri**. Visit the unique **khachkar studio** in **Gyumri**, where you will meet a wonderful Armenian, the **only Armenian woman-khachkar maker**. Tour of **Gyumri** and proceed to **Yerevan**, on the way visiting the **Aruch Cathedral (7th century)**. Drive back to **Yerevan**. Dinner in **Yerevan**. Overnight in **Yerevan**.

Day 6
Khor Virap/Noravank/Yerevan
250 km

Driving through the most fertile **Ararat Valley**, you will make a stop in **45 minutes** at the medieval **Khor Virap Monastery (4th-17th centuries)** with an incredible view of glorious **Mount Ararat**. **Khor Virap** has a special place in the history of Armenia and the adoption of **Christianity as a state religion in 301**. The name **Khor Virap** means a **Deep Dungeon**, where **Gregory The Illuminator** was **imprisoned by King Trdat for 13 years** and survived, proving the real God and true religion. The next stop is at the **Noravank Monastery (9th-14th centuries)**, the **masterpiece of Master Momik**. Lunch in a winery with **wine tastings**.

Visit also the recently excavated, very well-preserved **Copper Age settlement, Bird's Cavern**, which uncovers the secrets of **6,000-year-old wine production in Armenia**. The site boasts incredible items excavated in **2008-2010**, among which is the **world's oldest shoe, 5,500 years old**. Explore the unique cavern's **ritual and burial halls**. Drive back to **Yerevan**. Dinner in a restaurant. Overnight in **Yerevan**.

Day 7
Khor Virap/Noravank/Yerevan
250 km

A fascinating journey through the path of Christianity. **Echmiadzin** is the **spiritual center of Armenia**, the **Armenian Vatican**. It is a truly amazing experience to visit the **Echmiadzin Mother Cathedral**, one of the **world's most ancient churches**, built and consecrated by **St. Gregory the Illuminator** and **St. Trdat the Great in 303 AD**. Echmiadzin translates literally to "**the place where the Only Begotten Son of God descended**." According to tradition, **St. Gregory the Illuminator** saw a vision... and with a golden hammer struck the ground where the Cathedral was to be located. Echmiadzin is also the **See of the Armenian Apostolic Church** and the residence for its head, the **Catholicos**. Five kilometers towards **Yerevan** from Echmiadzin there are the ruins of **Zvartnots**. It was added to the **UNESCO World Heritage list in 2000**.

Day 7
Khor Virap/Noravank/Yerevan
250 km

The temple was a **three-tiered, central-domed structure** that astounded with its magnificence. According to the opinion of European specialists, the **Temple of Zvartnots** may be ranked with the **greatest monuments of ancient architecture**. Lunch in **Echmiadzin**.

Drive back to **Yerevan**, and continue to the **Cascade**, a long stairway alongside multiple levels of fountains with its amazing sculptures by world-famous artists such as **Botero, Chadwick, and Flanagan**. Visit the **Republic Square** with its magnificent buildings enhanced by singing fountains, via **Northern Avenue**—an ambitious project of independent Armenia—to **Freedom Square** and the **Opera House**. Your visit also includes the **Genocide Memorial and Museum**. Farewell Dinner in a restaurant. Overnight in **Yerevan**.

Departure from Yerevan
